Day 6 – God Brings Life to the Dead

- Isaiah 26:19 ""But your dead will live, Lord; their bodies will rise - let those who dwell in the dust wake up and shout for joy." [NIV]
- **Psalm 85: 6-7 -** "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? Show us your unfailing love, Lord, and grant us your salvation.



1. What This Means

- Isaiah shifts the tone from whispers and distress to resurrection and awakening.
- It's a bold promise: what looks dead in your life hope, health, relationships, finances, faith is not beyond God's reach. He specialises in bringing dead things back to life.
- This isn't just about physical resurrection. It's about reviving what you've given up on, what you've buried in silence, what you've labelled "too far gone."

2. God the Life Giver

- God doesn't just repair things. He resurrects them.
- His power is not limited by decay, distance, or delay.
- He can revive a heart, a home, a dream, a marriage, a destiny etc.
- He speaks to dead wombs, dry bones, dead ends, and life comes rushing back.

If He can raise Jesus, He can raise what's failing in your world.

3. How To Trust God To Revive What Feels Dead

 Admit what feels dead: Don't deny the pain or pretend everything's fine. Trust begins when you're honest with God about what seems lost, broken, or beyond repair.

- Bring the dead thing to God: Just like Mary and Martha brought news of Lazarus to Jesus, bring your "dead" situation to God. Say, "Lord, if You don't move, this won't live again but I trust You can."
- Speak life even when you feel doubt: Trust isn't the absence of doubt, it's choosing to declare resurrection even when feelings haven't caught up. Say, "I believe You can raise this, even if I don't see how."
- Release the timeline: Trust means surrendering not just the situation but also when and how God revives it. Resurrection is on His clock, but it always comes with purpose.

4. Real-Life Applications

- Finances/Debt: If your financial situation looks "dead," remember: God can resurrect ruined credit, closed doors, and dried-up income streams. Speak life over your resources.
- Marriage: If love has grown cold, God can rekindle warmth, forgiveness, and passion. A marriage that feels over can be revived through His Spirit.
- **Children:** If your child has walked away from truth or lost their way, trust the resurrection power of God. He can wake up what looks spiritually asleep.
- **Health:** When energy is gone or healing feels out of reach, declare: "Lord, breathe life into my body. Revive what is fading."
- **Faith:** When your spiritual life feels flat or far, God can breathe into dry bones. One word from Him can bring fresh fire.
- **Purpose/Dreams:** That calling, vision, or assignment you once burned for God can reignite it. What's dormant is not dead it's waiting for His breath.
- **Grief/Loss:** Even through mourning, He promises joy will return. Life will never be the same, but it can be full again.

5. Prayer/Meditation

"Lord, You are the God who brings life to the dead. Today, I lift up everything that feels broken beyond repair, buried under disappointment, or written off by others.

I speak life to my finances - breathe on them again.

I speak life to my marriage - revive connection and joy.

I speak life to my children - awaken their hearts to You.

I speak life to my body - renew my health and strength.

I speak life to my dreams - ignite them again.

I speak life to my faith - let it rise in power.

Even if I've been silent, hopeless, or numb, wake me up. Call me out of the dust. Let me rise with joy, knowing nothing is impossible for You. Amen."

Key Takeaway: Nothing in your life is too far gone for God. What you've labelled "dead" is not beyond His reach. When God speaks, what's buried wakes up. Your job is not to figure out how, it's to believe that the Life-Giver is still breathing.
