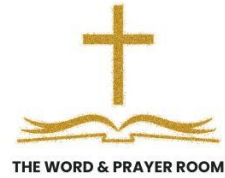

## Settled Series

### Day 1: If God Said It, It's a Done Deal

What more are you hoping to hear?

#### Key Scripture:

"All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realise what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work." 2 Timothy 3:16–17 (NLT)

#### Context: The Word already spoke

Most people don't reject the Bible because they've read it – they reject it because they haven't, Or because they don't understand or like what it says. But here's the uncomfortable truth: God has already spoken. Not through random opinion, but through a consistent, preserved message across centuries – a message that still holds up under scrutiny and continues to change lives.

Let the facts speak for themselves:

- The Bible is the most widely read and distributed book in human history.
- Over 5 billion copies have been printed and shared around the world.
- It's been fully translated into more than 740 languages, with parts available in over 3,500 languages.
- Each year, around 100 million Bibles are printed – that's more than 273,000 copies per day.
- It has outlived empires, survived censorship, and resisted cultural trends – and it's still here.
- It wasn't designed to be fashionable – it was designed to be foundational.
- And despite centuries of critique, cultural shifts, and outright attack – it still stands.

When the Apostle Paul wrote to Timothy, he reminded him that all Scripture is God-breathed – not man-made, not crowd-sourced, not edited for convenience. It's truth from the mouth of God Himself. And yet, we treat it like a magazine – something to browse, pick through, highlight the bits we like, and ignore what makes us uncomfortable. But the Bible was never meant to be browsed. It was

meant to be believed. And once believed – obeyed. If God’s Word is true – and the evidence says it is – then the real question isn’t did He say it? It’s why are we still waiting to believe it?

## Research that backs this up

- **Manuscript credibility:** The New Testament alone has over 5,800 Greek manuscripts, and more than 24,000 in total – far more than any other ancient document.
- **Survival and transmission:** Despite centuries of attack, the Bible remains the best-preserved ancient text in history.
- **Archaeological accuracy:** Discoveries continue to confirm the existence of places, people, and events recorded in Scripture (e.g. the Hittites, Pontius Pilate, King David).
- **Prophetic precision:** Unlike vague predictions, Scripture contains hundreds of fulfilled prophecies, especially regarding the life and death of Jesus – verified by historical events.

This isn’t emotional hype. It’s historical substance.

## Why this matters now

Because we’re addicted to second opinions. We want options, loopholes, backup plans. We want truth that agrees with us – not truth that changes us. Meanwhile, the Word of God has already spoken. Clearly. Powerfully. Unapologetically. We don’t have a truth problem. We have a trust problem. We’re waiting for more signs, more feelings, more clarity – when what we really need is conviction.

## Why we struggle with this

- **We want a God who agrees with us.** But God doesn’t echo us – He reshapes us.
- **We think clarity will cancel out fear.** But God never promised full explanations – only full faithfulness.
- **We treat spiritual truth like personal preference.** We like to customise our convictions – but God doesn’t do edited truth.
- **We want to feel it before we follow it.** But faith that only moves when it’s comfortable isn’t faith at all.

## Verse Breakdown: 2 Timothy 3:16–17 (NLT)

- **“All Scripture is inspired by God...”** Not some. Not the popular bits. All of it - even the parts that correct you.
- **“...useful to teach us what is true...”** Truth is not subjective. It’s sourced - and this is the source.
- **“...corrects us... equips us...”** The Word is not just information - it’s formation. It’s not optional advice. It’s divine instruction.

## Key Themes

- God has already spoken – the next move is ours.
- The Bible doesn’t need editing – it needs trusting.
- We’re not waiting for more proof – we’re avoiding conviction.
- The Word isn’t passive – it’s confrontational.
- Faith starts when excuses stop.

## Practical Application

- **Write down one verse or truth from Scripture** that you know you’ve been avoiding – and ask yourself why.
- **Turn down the noise.** For 24 hours, fast from second opinions. No scrolling. No Googling. Just open your Bible and sit with what’s already written.
- **Act on one instruction.** Pick a command from Jesus (love, forgive, serve, give, pray) – and put it into action today.
- **Reflect honestly.** Have you been browsing the Bible like a magazine - or reading it as if your life depends on it?

## Prayer

Father, You’ve already spoken - but I’ve been stalling. Forgive me for searching for more signs when Your Word was already enough. Strip away my excuses. Quiet every competing voice. Give me the courage to stop waiting and start living like Your Word is final. In Jesus’ name - Amen.

✦ **Final Takeaway:** If God already said it - stop waiting for Him to repeat it. You’re not stuck because God hasn’t spoken. You’re stuck because you’re still negotiating. But if God said it – it’s a done deal.
